The Funeral Liturgy is a source of Comfort and Strength for all who attend: "Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted" Mt 3:4.

The Ministry Of Consolation invites you to participate in the Funeral Liturgy.

The Family can do this by choosing Music and Scripture Readings for the Mass of Christian Burial Liturgy. The family or friends can also Proclaim these Readings if they are comfortable reading in public. We realize that this is a difficult time so if you are unable to make the selections they will be chosen for you by the Priest /Celebrant and the Music Director.

Scripture Readings

The Scripture Readings can be found in the Book <u>From Death</u> <u>to Life</u> which can be obtained from the Funeral Director. You may choose a reading from the Old Testament (Section C pages 26-30) and the New Testament (section E pages 45-55) **or just one reading if you wish**. Note During Easter time (Easter to Trinity Sunday) the Old Testament reading is not used; it is replaced by a New Testament reading (Section C pages 31-34) If the Funeral Director does not have a copy of <u>From Death to Life</u> you may make the selections from the book <u>Order of Christian Funerals</u> (pages 208-247).

The Gospel will be chosen by the Celebrant.

The Mass of Christian Burial makes use of symbols to strengthen our Faith. The white Pall (symbolizing Baptism) is placed on the coffin at the beginning of the Mass. Family or friends may want to do this. Family members or friends may want to present the gifts of bread and wine at the Presentation of the Gifts. Our Ministry of Consolation is available to help you plan your Mass of Christian Burial when they conduct the Wake Service. A minister of Consolation will call to arrange the Wake Service. If you have any questions or wish to talk to a minister of Consolation earlier, call the Rectory and ask for help from this Ministry.

Eulogy

It is preferred that any **Eulogy be given during the Wake**Service or at the Cemetery. The Eulogy given at the end of the Mass of Christian Burial must be based on the **faith-life** of the deceased and is limited to one person for two minutes.

In order to be given at the end of the Mass, the Eulogy must be submitted in writing at least a day ahead of the Mass and be approved by the Celebrant.
