

## **World Youth Day Reflection**

My name is TJ Mark. I am grateful to have made my first pilgrimage, which would not have been possible without the support of many. I am very grateful to have had the support of prayers and generosity from family and friends, and especially Fr. Sean and the parishioners of Holy Family where I've made all my sacraments and attended Mass my whole life.

Attending World Youth Day is truly a decision that I made consciously and intentionally on my own in growing my Catholic faith. My parents chose for me to be baptized and I chose to be confirmed. However, it was a decision I made because "it was the right thing to do." However, as I sat at one Sunday Mass a few years ago, I heard Fr. Sean speak about World Youth Day and decided I wanted to grow closer to God.

I learned many lessons during the WYD pilgrimage, but if I could take away one lesson it would be that life is all about perspective. When the day came to start traveling, I was feeling apprehensive and started to doubt my decision, but I promised my family and myself that I would try to have a positive mindset and have a good time. After the first day, I remember feeling exhausted, thinking, "I still have 6 days left of this." However, the longer the journey went on, the better it felt. I started appreciating every little moment more and I enjoyed myself more than I could have ever imagined. I can't explain how, but I genuinely felt God's presence there. In the past, I had my doubts if God is real, but I always kept attending Mass and convinced myself that I just had to have faith. However, the WYD trip was the first time I truly put all my attention toward God without any distractions, and I am now sure that God is there, just waiting to be seen by everyone. Perspective is so important because if I had a negative mindset towards the trip, I could have gone through the same activities, but I would have been bored the whole time and would've had a terrible experience. However, since I took a perspective of trying to enjoy myself and get closer to God, I can truly say that it was one of the best weeks of my life, and I am now taking on habits such as daily rosary to strengthen my relationship with God. I also had great experiences with other pilgrims from Holy Family and met pilgrims from all over the world.

As I reflect on my trip to Lisbon, I realize that it did not begin with Msgr. Furnari's special blessing in the Church parking lot right before the Holy Family pilgrims departed. My journey commenced a few years ago as I sat in the pew listening to Fr. Sean, meeting the other pilgrims who were merely friendly familiar faces I saw at Mass for fourteen years, then getting to know, bond with, and work together with my new friends, and appreciating all those who see the value of youth in the Catholic Church and supported our events.

You were all in my thoughts and prayers throughout my journey. I am grateful to bring this experience back home and to further grow my faith.


