LENTEN REGULATIONS

Traditionally in the Catholic Church, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday—These are days of Fast & Abstinence from meat. There is a limit of one full meal on these days for everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive. All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence from Meat. All who are 14 and older are bound to abstain totally from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial (like giving up something difficult) are recommended.

Dear Parishioners,

Why do we veil images?

The last few days of the season of Lent are called Passiontide. This is when the Church shifts her focus from Christ in the desert to Christ during His Passion. During this period of Passiontide, you will notice that the crucifix above the tabernacle and other statues and images around the church have been veiled with a purple cloth.

The practice of veiling images alerts us that something is different, it can be startling at first, but the last two weeks of Lent are a time of immediate preparation for the celebration of the Sacred Triduum.

The veiled images build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. The veils seem out of place, and even counterintuitive. Through the absence of images, our senses are heightened, and we become more aware of what is missing. Just like the suppression of the Alleluia during Lent effectively demonstrates that. When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we can see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His Resurrection.

We are being reminded that Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. John 11:25-26

Holy Week

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the holiest week of the year for Christians. Again, we will remember with many "signs" the power of the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Palm Sunday we will carry and hold palms to celebrate Jesus entering Jerusalem for the Passover.

Holy Thursday we will remember the Last Supper, the Washing of Feet, the Institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood, as well as the Agony in the Garden.

On Good Friday we will remember and accompany Jesus to His Crucifixion. Holy Saturday we will continue our mourning to prepare our hearts for His Easter Resurrection. Other than the Incarnation and Birth of Jesus, almost every other great mystery of faith is celebrated during Holy Week.

Please do your best to attend the Liturgies of the Triduum from Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday.

Join us for a special Tenebrae service at Wednesday, March 27th @7pm .

The Mass of the Lord's Last Supper is at 7pm on Thursday, March 28th.

The remembrance of the Lord's Passion is at 3pm on Friday, March 29th.

The Easter Vigil is at 8pm Saturday, March 30th.

The Easter Sunday Masses are at 6:15am (Outdoor Sunrise Mass) 7:30am, 9am, and 10:30am and 12noon. Have a great week!

who prowl throughout the world


